Welcome to the 2019 *America's Thanksgiving Parade*® presented by Art Van celebrating "Detroit Shining Bright". Enclosed is all the information necessary to make your Parade participation successful and enjoyable.

Arrival Location: Wayne State University, Parking Structure #2

Parking & Shuttle: You will park at the beginning of the Route and after you march in The Parade, will be shuttled back to the Parking Structure #2. The shuttle is located at the corner of Woodward & Jefferson Avenue (Refer to Map #11) **The last shuttle leaves at 1:00 P.M.**

Arrival Time: 7:00 A.M.

Please allow yourself enough time to arrive at your designated location on time.

Check-In Street in Assembly: FERRY

(Refer to Page #7 for Assembly Map)

Step Off Time: 10:25 A.M.

Step Off is located on Woodward Avenue at Mack Avenue. This time is flexible and may change.

Parade Route: On Woodward from Kirby to Congress (Page #8 is the Parade Route Map)

TV Zone Appearance: 11:40 A.M.

Please note this time is only an approx. as of 11.15.19; times could change between now and Parade Day. TV Zone is located on Woodward Avenue at State Street (Refer to Page #9, TV Zone Map)

Pick-Up Dispersal Location: Head south on Woodward to Jefferson Avenue to meet the shuttle bus back to Assembly. (Page #11 is the Dispersal Map)

Vehicle Pass: Display in windshield on driver's side

The enclosed window barricade pass should be displayed in your windshield and will allow you to get through police barricades.

DIRECTIONS WAYNE STATE UNIVERSITY STRUCTURE #2

Costuming:

Wayne State University Student Center (Second Floor), 5221 Gullen, Detroit MI 48202

Location:

Williams Mall between W. Third Street / Anthony Wayne Drive & Gullen Mall

on the Wayne State University Campus

Building Entry:

Enter building from Williams Mall (Southside of Building)

Parking:

Wayne State University Parking Structure #2, 5150 Lodge Service Drive, Detroit MI 48202

Entrance is on W. Third St/Anthony Wayne Drive between Kirby and Ludington Mall

Parking Pass required for entry into parking deck. See back of parking pass for map.

From M-10 (John C. Lodge) Southbound: Exit at West Grand Blvd. Turn LEFT at West Grand Blvd. Proceed to W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive (one long block). Turn RIGHT (South) on W. Third Street St/Anthony Wayne Drive. Continue South on W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive, pass the Ford Freeway over-pass (approximately 2/3 of a mile). The parking deck will be on the right. Turn RIGHT into the Wayne State University Parking Structure #2.

From M-10 (John C. Lodge) Northbound: Exit at the W. Forest Avenue. Turn RIGHT on W. Forest Avenue. Proceed to W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive (approximately two blocks). Turn LEFT at W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive. Proceed North (approximately .7 of a mile). The parking deck will be on the LEFT just pass W. Kirby Street. Turn LEFT into the Wayne State University Parking Structure #2.

From I-75 Southbound: Exit at East Grand Blvd. Turn RIGHT at East Grand Blvd. Proceed to W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive (Past Woodward Avenue). Turn LEFT (South) onto W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive. Continue South on W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive, pass the Ford Freeway over-pass (approximately 2/3 of a mile). The parking deck will be on the right. Turn RIGHT into the Wayne State University Parking Structure #2.


From I-75 Northbound (Downriver): Exit to the John C. Lodge Freeway (M-10) North. Follow the John C. Lodge Freeway (M-10) North to the W. Forest Avenue exit. Turn RIGHT on W. Forest Avenue. Proceed to W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive (approximately two blocks). Turn LEFT at W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive. Proceed North (approximately .7 of a mile). The parking deck will be on the LEFT just pass W. Kirby Street . Turn LEFT into the Wayne State University Parking Structure #2.

From I-94 Westbound: Take the John C. Lodge Freeway (M-10) North to West Grand Blvd/W. Milwaukee exit. Turn RIGHT onto W. Milwaukee Street. Proceed to W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive (one block). Turn RIGHT on W. Third Street/Anthony Wayne Drive, pass the Ford Freeway over-pass (approximately 2/3 of a mile). The parking deck will be on the right. Turn RIGHT into the Wayne State University Parking Structure #2.




Walking Directions from Wayne State University Structure #2 to Woodward Avenue



TV Zone Etiquette


DO's

- SMILE
- Dance & Wave
- Keep up with your unit
- · Look Uniformed
- Watch & listen to the TV Crew guiding you through the zone
- · Speed up when asked
- · Slow down when asked
- Keep it clean
- Be patient
- Perform!!!
- HAVE FUN!!!

DON'TS

- Smoke or Drink
- Talk on cell phone or radio
- Wear unapproved costumes and / or clothes
- · Make profane gestures
- Carry unapproved banners or signs
- · Hand out or throw items to the crowd
- FROWN

FAILURE to abide by these rules will result in immediate removal from The Parade Route and you not be asked back to future events!!



How To Dress On Parade Day!

Layer Up

The best way to dress for winter is to wear layers. This gives you flexibility to add or remove layers, depending on the weather. In general, three main layers are wicking, insulating and weather protection.

WICKING LAYER: This is the layer worn next to your skin, usually consisting of long underwear.

- Look for thermal underwear made of a synthetic usually polyester fiber that has "wicking" power. This means
 the fibers will wick (move) moisture away from your skin and pass it through the fabric so it will evaporate.
 This keeps you warm, dry and comfortable. Silk is also a good, natural fabric that has wicking abilities.
- Even though it's cold, you will sweat especially if you're walking THREE miles down the Parade route.

INSULATING LAYER: This middle layer includes sweaters, sweatshirts, vests and pullovers. The purpose of this layer is to keep heat in and cold out, which is accomplished by trapping air between the fibers. Popular insulation materials include:

- Fleece, a synthetic material which maintains its insulating ability even when wet and spreads the moisture out so it dries quickly.
- · Wool, which naturally wicks away moisture.

PROTECTION LAYER: The exterior layer, generally a shell and pants, serves as your guard against the elements of winter. It should repel water from snow, sleet or rain and block the wind, while also letting perspiration evaporate.

Most genuine winter shells and pants are made waterproof and breathable to some extent by using tightly woven fabrics teamed with a coating or laminate. This keeps moisture on the outside but allows perspiration to escape, keeping you dry and comfortable.

Depending on the weather and type of winter activity you will be doing, you may be interested in un-insulated pants and jackets/shells, or garments with increasing amounts of insulation.

Accessorize

HEADWEAR: Up to 60 percent of your body's heat can escape from an uncovered head, so wearing a hat or headband is essential when it's cold. (TIP: Look for headbands or hats in fleece or wool with non-itch liners)

GLOVES & MITTENS: Look for gloves and mittens that use waterproof, breathable fabrics. Mittens, in general, are warmer than gloves, but offer you less dexterity.

Please note, do NOT wear any logo apparel on Parade Day.

Fashion Tips

Don't wear jeans or street pants. Denim is not waterproof, so water will soak through and you'll end up cold, wet and miserable.

Cotton is a no-no. Cotton is great for towels, because cotton soaks up and retains moisture. That's precisely why cotton is all wrong for Parade Day. It absorbs moisture (sweat, snow, rain) and retains it. When the wind blows, you will get very, very cold. Don't wear cotton athletic socks, cotton jeans, cotton sweatshirts or cotton shirts.
